Программа дополнительного образования по английскому языку для ВЗРОСЛЫХ ОБУЧАЮЩИХСЯ

«English File Pre-intermediate»

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1. Комплекс основных характеристик программы

1.1.Пояснительная записка (Уровень Pre-intermediate на основе EF Pre-intermediate 4th edition)

Практический курс обучения английскому языку рассчитан на взрослых слушателей, которые изучали английский язык в школе или других учебных заведениях, и владеют базовым уровнем языка на момент обращения в компанию «Английский Клуб», а также для тех, кто закончил уровень Elementary по любому из имеющихся пособий.

Актуальность курса определяется постоянно возрастающей ролью английского языка в современном обществе, интересом к англоязычной культуре и международными контактами на всех уровнях. Знания, полученные по окончании курса, могут послужить основой для дальнейшего совершенствования владения английским языком, что является одной из составляющих успешной карьеры, повышает самооценку и расширяет горизонты общения офлайн или онлайн с представителями других культур, использующими английский в качестве языка международного общения.

Образовательной задачей курса является расширение знаний по истории и культуре англоговорящих стран и других стран мира, расширение кругозора на основе материалов, включающих информацию полезную для обогащения знаний в разнообразных областях.

1.2.Цели и Задачи курса:

ЦЕЛЬЮ курса является формирование у студентов представления о системе языка, его структуре и функционировании, а также его особенностях в сравнении с родным языком.

Непосредственной **ЗАДАЧЕЙ** практического курса является сообщить слушателям современные знания о системе английского языка, научить их читать, писать и объясняться на английском языке, на данном уровне. Слушатели приобретают правильные навыки английского произношения, умение свободно и правильно пользоваться грамматическими структурами и словарным запасом, предусмотренным программой данного курса.

Программа курса представляет собой интегрированную программу, составленную на основе учебной программы "English File Pre-Intermediate 4th edition", разработанной авторами Clive Oxenden, Christina Latham-Koenig & Jerry Lambert, и международного экзамена "A2 Key" (KET). Прохождение языкового материала по этой интегрированной программе рассчитано на 180 академических часов. Занятия проходят 2 раза в неделю по 2 или 3 академических часа.

Курс "English File Pre-Intermediate" состоит из книги для учащихся и учителя, рабочей тетради, аудио сопровождения, видеокурса с заданиями по темам, сборника тестов и заданий Online Practice. В качестве дополнительных материалов используются игры, задания, упражнения и песни в блоках Grammar Activities, Communicative Activities, Vocabulary Banks, Songs.

В обучении доминирует коммуникативный подход, наряду с комбинированием различных подходов, принципов и элементов других методов (традиционного и интенсивного) с учетом специфики этапа обучения и конкретных условий. Упор в обучении делается на развитие устной речи, которая является как средством, так и методом обучения.

В процессе обучения проводится как текущий контроль, так и промежуточные тесты после каждого модуля (краткий тест) и каждого 6 модуля (промежуточный тест). В конце курса слушатели проходят итоговое тестирование. Экзаменационные итоговые тесты разработаны методистами компании «Английский Клуб» и охватывают все аспекты языковой и речевой подготовки, необходимой на данном этапе изучения английского языка (слушание, говорение, чтение, письмо, лексико-грамматическая часть). Финальный тест состоит из 2 основных частей – письменной и устной. Письменная часть включает тест, состоящий из 4 частей: слушание, чтение, письмо, лексико-грамматическая часть. Устная часть состоит из 2 частей: тема и беседа по картинкам на одну из тем программы. Объём высказываний по теме у учащихся в среднем составляет 15-20 предложений. Раскрывая выше обозначенные темы, слушатели демонстрируют знание и правильное использование лексики и грамматики данного учебного курса.

По окончании курса слушатели проходят финальное тестирование и получают сертификат образовательной компании «Английский клуб», который имеет разные уровни отличия: Gold (золотой) - 95-100% , Silver (серебряный) - 80-94%, Red (красный) - 70-79%, Green (зеленый) - 60-69%, Blank (прослушал курс) - менее 60%.

2.3. Организационно – педагогические условия реализации программы

Форма проведения занятий: аудиторная.

Формы организации образовательной деятельности: групповая и индивидуальная.

Для реализации программы используется практико-ориентированный подход, что обусловлено, в том числе, актуальностью изучения иностранного языка как инструмента коммуникации.

Формы и методы работы со взрослыми:

- фронтальная работа
- работа учащихся в парах и группах
- индивидуальная работа
- анализ конкретных ситуаций
- дискуссия
- мозговой штурм
- выполнение проектов и мини-проектов
- игры-знакомства
- игры на запоминание материала
- игры-театрализации
- разучивание тематических песен
- уроки-праздники

Программа следует основным тенденциям в развитии современной методики обучения иностранным языкам:

- коммуникативной направленности;
- активации речемыслительной деятельности учащихся в процессе овладения языком как средством общения;
- повышение мотивации учения;
- индивидуальному подходу к студентам;
- техническому оснащению учебного процесса.

Групповые занятия строятся следующим образом:

- 1) Вводная часть:
- приветствие, орг. момент;
- фонетическая разминка.
 - 2) Основная часть:
- лексический материал по теме занятия;

- речевой материал по теме;
- пение песен;
- игры на закрепление материала;
- задания для самостоятельной работы и их проверка.
 - 3) Заключительная часть:
- закрепление пройденного материала в виде игр, диалогов, речевых ситуаций;
- творческое задание прикладного характера;
- ориентировка на следующее занятие.

Материально-техническое обеспечение

Для методического обеспечения дополнительной общеразвивающей программы по английскому языку для обучающихся имеется в наличии:

- отдельный кабинет;
- комплект столов и стульев согласно количеству обучающихся;
- доска;
- стол для педагога;
- раздаточный материал (дидактические игры и пособия, тесты и задания для самостоятельной работы, иллюстративная наглядность);
- медиапроектор или телевизор.

Планируемые результаты

Ступень Pre-Intermediate — это важный рубеж, преодолев который студент перейдет из разряда базового пользователя в категорию независимых пользователей. Программа этого уровня предполагает расширение словарного запаса за счет таких тем, как внешность, характер и личность, человеческое тело, профессии и образование, биография, средства транспорта, климат, хобби и др., а также за счет большой группы фразовых глаголов, более сложных понятий, таких как межкультурные и межличностные отношения, этикетные нормы, фобии, биографии, изобретения, устройства и механизмы, закон подлости и рассуждения о гипотетических ситуациях.

По окончании курса учащийся сможет общаться на любую из перечисленных выше тем, подкрепляя свои слова примерами из жизни. Словарный запас обогатится устойчивыми словосочетаниями и фразовыми глаголами. Грамматический багаж пополнится новыми временами, модальными глаголами, пассивным залогом и условными предложениями, а словарный запас увеличится до 2000 слов. Учащийся поймет, когда уместно использовать герундий и инфинитив, приобретет уверенность в употреблении сложных временных форм и освоит косвенную речь. Таким образом, доведя до автоматизма базовые модели и структуры и получив представление о более сложных конструкциях, учащийся подойдет к уровню Intermediate в полной готовности.

Кроме того, по окончании курса студент сможет:

- читать адаптивную литературу, соответствующую данному уровню;
- участвовать в разговоре на знакомые бытовые темы;
- написать краткое письмо, записку или сообщение.

По окончании курса Pre-intermediate слушатель может продолжить обучение на уровне Intermediate.

3. ОЦЕНОЧНЫЕ И МЕТОДИЧЕСКИЕ МАТЕРИАЛЫ

Программа для взрослых учащихся предусматривает безоценочный подход. Проверка знаний осуществляется в следующих формах контроля:

- Текущий (осуществляется на каждом занятии);

Результат выше 60% считается удовлетворительным, выше 75% - хорошим, выше 80% - отличным. % ниже 60 свидетельствует о недостаточном результате для конкретного уровня и требует выполнения работы над ошибками и дополнительного консультирования обучающегося. So, a big pile of broken plates means you are a popular person.

Enjoy the new year festival, wherever you are in the world. I hope you are ready with your grapes, luggage and plates!

Dog therapy

Our health editor, Nikki Langer, interviewed three people whose jobs show that dogs can improve human health.

Ben Forster, dog trainer

Dogs are the most common therapy animal because they are easy to train, and because there are many different sizes. For a hospital visit, for example, it might be important to have a small dog which someone can hold on their lap. The most important thing, though, is the dog's personality: it must be calm and quiet. Most therapy dogs are not puppies – they are usually at least three years and older – and they have to complete a special training course before they can work in hospitals or schools. There are many benefits for the patients and children. Research has shown that regular contact with dogs can improve physical and mental health.

Jasmin Hussain, tutor

I used to have mental health problems. A few years ago, my doctor recommended getting a dog. She said that walking with a dog and caring for it would help me to recover — and that was true for me. Now Domino comes to the university with me and helps my students. She sits in my office during my classes. When my office door is open, students know they can come in and talk to Domino. My university department has lots of international students and some of them are far away from home. One girl told me that she missed her pet dog more than her parents! If Domino didn't come to work with me, the students would definitely be sad. He's a great dog: very gentle and he loves it when people stroke him. Thanks to my students, he has also learned instructions in several languages!

Andrea Weber, nurse

I work at a residential home for elderly men and women. Our youngest resident is 85. A lot of the people who live here have long-term conditions. It can be hard for them to be active. But I know that every Tuesday, they will come to the main living room to see our pet therapist, Pat, and her beautiful dog Trixie. Trixie is a large dog, with lovely soft fur. When Trixie sits next to you, you want to talk to her and touch her. And while people are waiting to talk to Trixie, they talk to each other. It's a very positive thing.

The Sleep Cinema Hotel

For nearly 50 years, the Rotterdam Film Festival has shown unusual and exciting film projects from around the world. The organizers of the festival are creative and positive people. For example, when award-winning film director Apichatpong Weerasethakul wanted to show a film that lasted for more than 24 hours, the organizers said: 'No problem.' Apichatpong also wanted to create a hotel inside the cinema. Could the cinema provide beds and showers, and give the guests breakfast? 'No problem.'

The result of this discussion is the Sleep Cinema Hotel at this year's Rotterdam Film Festival. Six small beds are arranged in front of a cinema screen. The beds are on a metal structure so they are above the floor, like birds' nests. Guests are encouraged to spend all night here. If they wake up, they'll watch Apichatpong Weerasethakul's film for a while and then go back to sleep. The film has a lot of images of the sea and rivers. The sound is also important. All of the sounds in the film were recorded in Apichatpong's home country: Thailand. Of course, there are lots of water noises, but there are also the songs of small birds. And the screen is a circle so it looks like a head, or the sun or moon.

Apichatpong is familiar with sleeping in cinemas. He says: 'I always fall asleep during my movies ... and during other people's movies. The best cinema is inside your head.' He is interested in what happens when people sleep and especially in their dreams. This is one of the reasons why sleeping people are a common sight in his previous films. The hotel has a dream book where guests can write about the dreams they had in the Sleep Cinema Hotel. Perhaps surprisingly, so far most guests have said they slept very well in the cinema.

People without tickets for the hotel can watch the film – and the sleeping guests – from the balcony area. Hurry! The project is only open for five days.
